*Spring Quarterly* will be from Friday evening on May 12<sup>th</sup> to midday on Sunday, May 14<sup>th</sup> at Dwight Mission, nr. Sallisaw, OK. This is a gathering of Quakers from Arkansas and Oklahoma.

If you are led to **present a second hour program** for the Education slot (second and fourth Sundays) please let the Education Committee know! If you are led to present a Worship sharing on a third Sunday then let Ministry and Oversight Committee know.

The **Spring Book Study** will begin soon. A proposed text is *"Braiding Sweetgrass: Indigenous Wisdom, Scientific Knowledge and the Teachings of Plants"* by Robin Wall Kimmerer. Called the work of *"a mesmerizing storyteller with deep compassion and memorable prose"* (Publishers Weekly) and the book that, *"anyone interested in natural history, botany, protecting nature, or Native American culture will love,"* (Library Journal).

After *meeting for worship* and a coffee break we usually have an optional second hour program. They are **organized during the month** thus:

- 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday: a business meeting;
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday: an educational program;
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday: a worship sharing;
- 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday: an educational program;
- 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday: a potluck.

Of course we sometimes shuffle the pack as the need arises.

Brandon Weston will be leading a **spring hike** on Saturday, June 10<sup>th</sup> at Lake Fayetteville (paved trail, Veterans Park entrance) from 9 a.m. until noon. Kids welcome.

It is hoped that our meeting can organize a **regular vigil** with the intention of addressing concerns around "soothing the soul of the nation". If you are interested in joining this or have particular ideas of how this might be achieved please contact Mary Elsie Marchant.

For the past four years, through the voluntary help of Maya Porter, Meeting has been supporting the *Sunday Supper* program that several churches established as part of an effort to **provide food for low-income people**. She volunteered to assist Good Shepherd Lutheran Church on the fourth Sunday of the month to serve dinner at Trinity Method Church on Garland Ave. She is now ready to lay that obligation down.
