Invitation to Love: The Way of Christian Contemplation by Thomas Keating

This book is about Centering Prayer. Several weeks ago Nicholas Cole, who leads Centering Prayer retreats, spoke at a second hour. He told of Father Keating's work with this practice. For those of you who missed the presentation or who want to know more, this volume will be of interest.
